Message from Fr. Quinn

Praise the Lord! Greetings and salutations in the Lord Jesus Christ! In the famous words of Chris Stapleton, singer and songwriter, "Well the road rolls out like a welcome mat to a better place than the one we're at...." The song, "Starting Over," is an appropriate theme for the past week. In this the 33rd week of Ord Time we are on the verge of starting completely over with the season of Advent beginning on November 28th. How often do we really consider beginning again? Jesus says in the Gospel this weekend, "But that day or hour, no one knows," and perhaps that is what really trips our trigger--we simply do not know what lies ahead. We have no control over what has passed and we are left with the poverty of the moment, the poorness of having to live in the crucible of the troubled passed and the trepidation and tribulation of the future. In hearing confessions, I would have to assess that the primary frustration and helplessness that the penitent feels is the complete and total inability to abandon oneself to the Divine Will of God the Father in Heaven. He is the ONLY one that knows of the tribulations to come and the travesties of the past which are cloaked in a mysterious confusion and consternation. The fact that we continue to "grasp" and hold on to situations, people and events is a fault of our own spiritual wiring. Sin is the shortfall. Unfortunately, people nowadays don't think they sin because barely anyone confesses sin. God the Father, the JUDGE of the living and the dead, in His Divine Goodness, has a plan to be able to salvage our own incapacity to know the tribulations of our times. We see this culturally. There is coercion and pressure to codify the unknown. Routinely, we begin to see the systematic and problematic spirit of the end times wrestle with the poverty of the unknown. Disease and death. Life and mortality. Joy and sorry. Grace and sin. They are all the mysterious plot and plan of God's salvation history unraveling before our eyes and WE ARE NOT IN CONTROL. The solution? The solving of the case? Let go. Stop trying to control others. Stop trying to manipulate and coerce others into our own box of understanding. True wisdom and knowledge from the Almighty is the requisite resolve to release ourselves from the responsibility of thinking we know best. JESUS CHRIST, if we are willing to follow Him rather than our own limited mental capacity to figure out this crazy world is the Sovereign One who is coming. Perhaps coming soon. He is the One who sits at God's right hand for all eternity to judge the living and the dead. If our grasping and clawing to understand the mysteriousness of God's will does not cease, we will see our own sun darken. We will see the stars of our souls fall to the ground and die. Rather than the powers of heaven shaking with the disturbing news of calamity, our own souls will be gripped with the fear of our own impending death and decay. The unconscious fear of our own motivations and movements will be laid bare by the Almighty. The summer is near and our tender souls are only left with the vineyard keeper to prune our leaves of uncertainty. So if we think the tribulations of this time are as bad as what is to become at the finally judgement, we have another thing coming. "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." As G.K Chesterton would say, "Science must not impose any philosophy, any more than the telephone must tell us what to say." Science and data are no salvation to the human soul. Neither bitcoin or the behemoth bureaucracy of corporatism as manifest in government, education and dare say we, our Catholic Church, can squelch the impending power of Christ's return. Our trajectory is judgement and the sooner we own up to this the better. We can not cease the entropy of our lives and the world by some transhumanist subversion of the Divine Majesty. We will never be able to outlive ourselves. The imposition that comes at the end of starting over will be the judgement of the living and the dead. What side do we want to be on? The better place than the one we're at is NOT here. It is to come. It's called Advent.

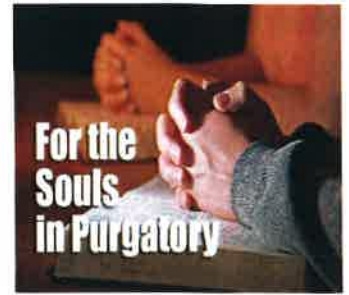
