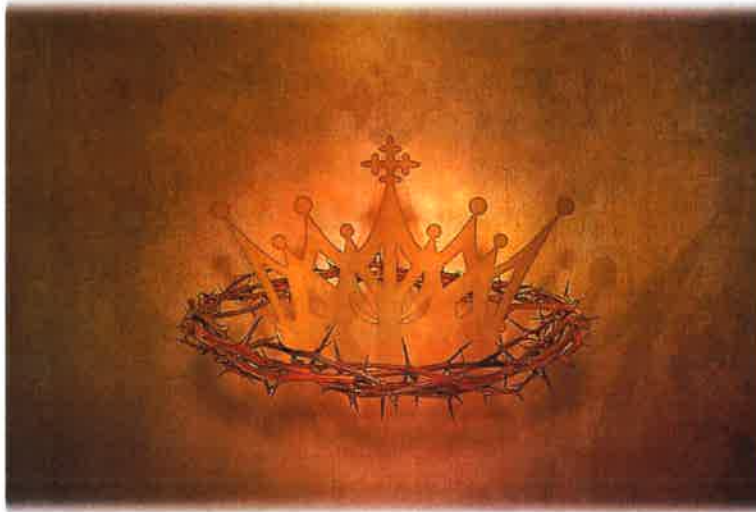

Message from Fr. Quinn

Praise the Lord! Pasties, pasties, pasties! Last Saturday, I was able to witness a genuine and remarkable event--The Pasty Sale. It was amazing to see many contribute peeling potatoes, mixing up the ground beef, dicing onions, making the dough and getting those pasties out the door. The smell in and of itself was enough to know that one needed to purchase a few and share with loved ones and friends. It is no small thing to come together, work together, laugh together, and be a community together. Thank you to all those involved especially Lori who spearheaded the endeavor. What a blessing to be able to see the cooperation and the commitment to so many to serve and love others. A reminder of the upcoming Spaghetti and Chicken Dinner coming up on Monday, November 22nd from 4pm-7pm. Perhaps consider inviting a friend or two to join you for the meal. On another note, we had our finance committee meeting last week as well. The presentations and the information were invaluable. I had the chance to see the Veteran's Day event at the Niagara High School and even one of our very own parishioners helped to organize the event. This was a special thing to see. The songs from the first graders to the presentations and speeches were inspiring. A special thank you to the veterans in attendance and all those who have served, thank you. There were a couple of our own parishioners in attendance, and on behalf of the parish, our sincere thank you for your service to God and Country.

We are now celebrating the end of the liturgical year and entering into Advent with the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Jesus was handed over and he says, "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews." Often we hand over the dominion and sovereignty of Jesus in our lives by not claiming Him as King. Compromising and "cow tailing," to temporal power undermines the reign of Christ in our hearts. Sin means to miss the mark. If we perpetually miss the mark in our lives, we have a Savior who is ready to forgive and forget. Confession of sin is a monumental gift given to us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession of sin is important but the confession of God's reign of love over sin is monumental. Advent then becomes a time of preparation. Let us be reminded that Christmas begins on December 25th, not anytime sooner. Advent is a season, in effect, that is penitential and prayerful. We can countdown to Christmas with an Advent calendar or a wreath and candles in our homes. We can light the tree on Christmas eve and no sooner to begin the festivities of Christmas as they were meant to be celebrated in the Octave of Christmas. Even saving Christmas songs for the 25th and beyond can be a penitential decision to remind us of the silent night before the incarnation. We can choose to be prayerful and vigilant as the season invites us to. Violet is the color used to remind us of the solemn solemnity of the Incarnation to Come. The third Sunday of Advent is signified by the color rose to remind us of the joy of Jesus coming to restore the supernatural kingship of the resurrections reign. Let us not "hand over" the upcoming liturgical season to the consumerist and commercial spirit of the day and age. Let us keep watch of the Baby King to come. Let us journey with the wise men in the spirit of true wisdom rather than the fragmented information of the digital world of our phones.

Please consider attending the book club lead by our RE director this Advent Season beginning Thursday, December 2nd at 6:30pm in the parish hall. Please consider attending our Advent dinner put on by our own parishioners out of love. Please consider attending our First Saturday Devotion to our Lady of Fatima with 8am Adoration, Rosary, Confession, Benediction and Mass. Let us sing with joyful hearts with the introduction of our new hymnals this Advent. Let's make this a special time in which we bow down to Christ the King.

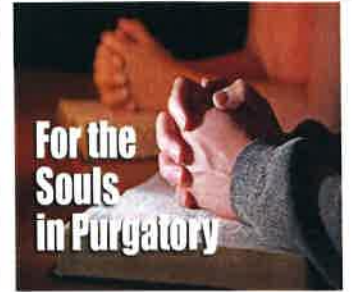
