A parishioner brought me up to the bluff overlooking the town and I was raised above the "Valley" that is Niagara. It was a different perspective than being down in on the river's edge and was quite remarkable to see just how different a raised look and vantage point can be. Not long after that I had another "raised" experience. We gathered in the parish hall for two meetings. The first was the Knights of Columbus meeting. It was so impressive to see the guys assemble and talk about caring for others and making donations for things such as renovating the rectory albeit a new "old" rectory! Thank you to the Knights! Freedom to assemble

and be together cannot be underestimated. What a grace to see the cooperation and comradery amongst the group. The report on the upcoming Duck Race was fun to listen to as well! By the time this report is written, the ducks will have floated a long way to raising funds for a good cause. Imagine what they look like from the top of the bluff. The seconded meeting that raised my awareness of how good this parish is and willing to contribute was the parish council meeting. Even in the dog days of summer, there was an amazing amount of you present. I can't recall how many were there but it was a lot! Present members and interested parishioners all keen on helping and contributing time, talent and treasure were there. I was amazed by the amount of experience brought to the table. Being raised is not an end of life thing but an everyday reality. APOLOGIA Continued from last week..... OBJECTIONS: Against the Pope and bishops

(Jesus) said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jona! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven (Mt 16:15-19).

Jesus is addressing Simon and renames him Peter, which means rock. In our language, it would be like Jesus saying: "You are rock and on this rock I will build my Church." Peter, with his renaming, is being singled out for a special mission. Just as God renames Abram to Abraham to reveal his mission (see Gen 17:5) and Abraham is even known as a 'rock' (see Isaiah 51:1-2), so too Jesus, renaming Simon to Peter, points to Peter's mission of being ROCK. The original language of Matthew's Gospel was Aramaic, so the word Matthew would have used is *kephas*. It was later translated in Greek to *petros* and *petra*. Jesus is also known as rock (one example found in 1 Cor 10:4), and all the faithful are called 'little rocks' (see 1 Peter 2:5-8).

We are going to need more information to determine what Jesus is doing here in renaming Peter. Jesus gives us another clue to Peter's new mission as he speaks of the keys of the kingdom. In the Davidic kingdom, there is a person who keeps the 'keys of the kingdom.' This is like the role Joseph had in Egypt under Pharaoh (see Gen 41:40-44). We see this role in Isaiah 22:15-24 where we hear of the replacement of Shebna with Eliakim, who receives the key to the house of David. By giving these keys to Peter and giving him the authority of binding and loosing, Jesus is handing his authority to Peter. The 'binding' and 'loosing' are rabbinic terms, referring to excommunication, this points to Peter's ability to make authoritative decisions regarding faith and morals. Jesus later breathes the Holy Spirit on all the apostles and gives them His authority (see Mt 28:18 for the authority given to the apostles and John 20:22 for the reception of the Holy Spirit to forgive sins)

It is readily accepted in the early Church that Peter holds primary place among the apostles (see in the book of Acts where Peter takes the lead in decisions). This primacy is handed to the next Pope, Linus, even though St. John the Apostle is still alive. The popes of the Catholic Church, in union with all the bishops, provide a central authority that gives unity to the Church. We call this teaching authority the Magisterium. Without a hierarchical structure, chaos ensues, and unity is lost, as is experienced in the continual fracturing among Protestants. Pope Benedict XVI says in *Verbum Domini*, "*In short, by the work of the Holy Spirit and under the guidance of the magisterium, the Church hands on to every generation all that has been revealed in Christ. The Church lives in the certainty that her Lord, who spoke in the past, continues today to communicate his word in her living Tradition and in sacred Scripture. Indeed, the word of God is given to us in sacred Scripture as an inspired testimony to revelation; together with the Church's living Tradition, it constitutes the supreme rule of faith*" (VD 18).

The unity of the Catholic Church also requires the assurance of those in authority teaching without error. When the Pope or Magisterium teach on matters of faith and morals in a definitive or solemn way, whether through a council, a letter, an exhortation, a public audience, or when the Pope speaks *ex cathedra*, they speak infallibly. This means they teach without error. Outside these specific definitive or solemn teachings, we recognize popes and bishops are fallible.
