Message from Fr. Quinn

Praise the Lord! A special thank you to everyone who gave to the Seminarian Collection Appeal. It was a joy to have Nathan Buddie stay with us and share his vocation testimony. As we were opening windows on 10ft and 20ft ladders during a wedding reception in the parish hall last Saturday evening to try and cool the place down, I thought to myself, "He will make a great diocesan priest...putting his life on the line to save the wedding party!" Thank you, Nathan for your willingness to follow Christ Jesus as a priest, an "Alter Christos" Also, thank you to Shanna & Joe Champeau who got the house ready by installing the Kohler toilet and making the bed. To be honest, I didn't think I'd have so many folks visit up here, but a lot of people come through this area. I had the blessing of a visit from a priest friend this week. I saw a family in Pembine who I had not seen in a long time at the 4pm and their son served with Ed. Two weeks ago, Kyle, a future seminarian brought a group of Camp Tekawitha to a daily Mass. A newly married couple who met on my former apostolate came to Aurora for Mass. The list could go on in just a few short weeks. A real blessing of priesthood to meet so many people and know their stories. It is a unique part of the vocation. Lastly, I would like to mention what an honor it was to do the funerals for Fredrick Rhodes and Charles Jakups. Both of the deceased served in the Armed forces and both had stormed the beach of Normandy. Taps at the Pembine Cemetery was very moving. I forgot to mention my congratulations to Caleb and Shannon Olsen on their wedding a week and a half ago. What a great couple. There's a saying in priestly ministry, "Marry and Bury 'em!" There has been a lot of action on those fronts the last couple of weeks. It was funny to hear Bryan DeForge say after last week's Sunday Mass, "Well you know, Father, that's what we do around here...get married and then die!" Death indeed comes to us all and we can't cheat "Father Time."

Speaking of, this weekend we celebrate the Assumption of our Blessed Mother into heaven. This means that at her death, we believe as Catholics that her body and soul were lifted up into heaven. Can you believe that?! I sure can because she was full of grace. Bishop Sheen said, "A denial of a devotion to Mary is a denial of the divinity of Christ." Mary was TOTALLY holy. It's important for us to see that she, "went in haste to see Elizabeth." When we cooperate with grace we move not in a hasty way, but with haste. This means that in the cooperation and communion with God and receiving His gifts most especially in the Sacraments of Confession and Eucharist we move with assurance and agency. We are focused and "dialed in." Mary, our Blessed Mother was so dialed in she was "dialed up."

Another important thing to remember here is that our body and souls go together. We are "embodied spirits," reflecting the image and likeness of God. Unfortunately we see in our day-and-age less and less respect for the body. For example, we see folks spread cremains of deceased love ones. This does not respect the basic belief that our bodies will be reunited in heaven with our soul. That is a Catholic belief. Spreading ashes is pagan. We cannot do funerals for those who want to spread ashes. Or another sad commentary on the way we bury our dead is that we hastily go through a funeral. The funeral should have three parts: First the vigil that takes place at the funeral home the night before. This gives folks a chance to pay their respects if they can't make the funeral Mass. It is also the proper place for the eulogy and the visitation so one can see the deceased. Second, the funeral Mass is where we pray for the deceased. We focus here on remembering what Jesus has done for our loved one. That He died and rose from the dead to give the deceased that same opportunity. Lastly the committal, the time in which we bless the graveside for the final resting place until the resurrection of the dead. But in our convenience and uncomfortable dealing with death we have unfortunately become hasty instead of moving in haste. The Assumption of the Blessed Mother Mary should give us pause about our own deaths and our own rising from the dead at the end times. Now that's some good conversation for the dining room table!
