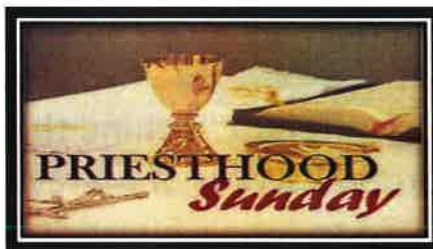

Message from Fr. Quinn

Praise the Lord!

We keep in prayer Jim who died in hospice care and had his funeral elsewhere. Special thanks to Jacob's Funeral Home, Perry and his wonderful team there. Thank you to those who help prepare things from the funeral meal (SACCW), to the prep work for the liturgy, the choir and the sacristans. It was really special to see SACCW pray at Dorothy's funeral for her as she was involved with that wonderful organization. I finally met the prayer shawl group as well. Thank you for that ministry. Seeing the guys prep for the Steak Fry was something else. I had some visitors this weekend and they really enjoyed the meal. My guest won the 50/50! What great community!

The Knights of Columbus met this week and they do such great work. I marvel at how well their meetings are conducted. If you want to combine faith and service through acts of charity please consider coming to the meetings. Saint Vincent de Paul is doing special work as well as Karen's Food Pantry. We are in week two of RE and the Catholic Schoolhouse (home school association) was gearing up to begin!

There are so many different "behind the scenes," volunteers who make things happen. The Corporal Works of Mercy are in full swing! Jesus says, "Do not prevent him," in response to John's questioning someone driving out demons in Jesus' name. Although they didn't belong to Jesus' group he still allowed them. Many times there are forces trying to prevent us from serving and loving others. We can be prevented by quarrels or squabbles. We can be prevented from helping because we are afraid of the commitment or the time involved. Perhaps we are prevented because of our own inhibitions or disagreements with others. However, let's never allow dark forces of evil to prevent us from throwing our hat in the ring! Being involved is not for the faint of heart. Preventing the tendency of our hearts to be prevented is the work of prayer. Prayer helps open our hearts. Prayer is the ultimate preventative measure! The behind the scenes and unseen works of love are not to be prevented but engendered. Thank you to all those whose hearts are not prevented from serving at our three linked parishes.

Now & Forever! Fr. Quinn

believe in Jesus and partake of the Eucharistic meal. We are now partakers of the divine nature – waiting to fully participate in heaven! Just as many disciples left when Jesus revealed His plan of providing the Eucharist, so too today many people leave the communion of the Catholic Church because they feel the teaching of the Eucharist is too hard.

Reconciliation – Confession: The key text for the practice of the sacrament of confession lies in John 20:21-23, *“Jesus said to them again, ‘Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you.’ And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.’”* Only God can forgive sins, yet Jesus shares his authority of forgiving sins with his apostles. Through apostolic succession, Catholic priests share in this authority as they absolve us of our sins. The celebration of this Sacrament of Healing has changed dramatically over the years, moving from a rare public confession of sin in front of the whole community to the frequent private confession of sin just to the priest. It is necessary to confess any known mortal sins before receiving the Eucharist (sins of grave matter committed with full knowledge and complete consent – like missing Mass on Sunday for no good reason!). It is a good practice to have regular confession times and even confess venial sins. We are told that a righteous man may fall seven times a day (see Prov 24:16). If we can’t come up with at least seven things we did or didn’t do (said or didn’t say) a day, then we just aren’t looking hard enough!

Anointing of the Sick: The key text for the practice of anointing the sick lies in James 5:14-16, *“Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects.”* This is exactly what the Church does in having the priest anoint a sick person and even offers Confession during an anointing. Should someone be unconscious when they receive the sacrament, all sins are forgiven. However, if the person survives the illness and is able to communicate later, they are obligated to confess any mortal sins. This holds true for any General Absolution that takes place in a grave emergency when the priest is allowed to absolve everyone of all sins in the face an impending doom. Any survivors are obligated to confess any mortal sins.

Holy Orders and Matrimony: These two sacraments of service are so important in continuing the work of God on earth. There are many passages in Scripture that point to both these sacraments, but we will quote only a couple:

“And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they believed” (Acts 14:23). The elders are also known as presbyters or priests.

“Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. Even so husbands should love their wives as their own bodies ... This is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the church; however, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.” (Eph 5:25-33)

Both of these sacraments image something of Christ. The priest shares in the eternal priesthood of Christ. Once a man is ordained, there is an indelible seal on his soul that is never taken away. Spouses image the union of Christ and His spouse, the Church.
